

Channel letters — front-lit, halo-lit, and combo-lit.

Front-lit, reverse-channel halo-lit, and face-and-halo combo letters with LED modules, low-voltage transformers, raceway or flush mount. Aluminum returns, acrylic faces, trim cap — fabricated to drawing and installed to tolerance.

Specification notes

Front-lit vs halo-lit

Front-lit letters glow through a translucent acrylic face — the whole letter reads illuminated, day and night. Halo-lit (reverse channel) letters have an opaque face and project light backward onto the wall as a soft glow tracing the letter shape. Halo reads architectural and premium; front-lit reads retail and is generally easier to permit and re-lamp.

Raceway, backer, or flush mount

Raceway is the simplest electrical install (one box, one wall penetration), preferred by landlords. Backer panels make the set read as one unit. Flush mount looks cleanest but needs multiple penetrations and suits new construction over retrofits. Survey and drawing review decides per site.

Service life

The aluminum and acrylic substrate carries 10-15 years. LED modules carry 5-7 year manufacturer warranties, transformers 3-5 years. The install includes documented re-lamp access, so service is a module swap, not a rebuild.
