

Vehicle and fleet graphics — wraps, partials, cut vinyl.

Full wraps, partial wraps, and cut-vinyl lettering on cars, vans, trucks, and trailers. Multi-region fleet rollouts with consistent specs — cast films like 3M IJ180Cv3 and Avery MPI 1105 for conformability, finished with matched-spec overlaminates.

Specification notes

Cast or calendered

Cast films (3M IJ180Cv3, Avery MPI 1105, Oracal 3951) for wraps that cross rivets, recesses, and compound curves; up to 10-year vertical durability under their matched-component systems. Calendered films (3M IJ39, Avery MPI 1405, Oracal 3651) for flat panels, simple-curve box trucks, and shorter-term promotional fleet at 3-5 years. The contour decides, not the price.

Full wrap timeline

A passenger van or SUV is a 1-2 day install with one experienced two-person crew. Box trucks run 2-3 days; Sprinters and step vans land in between. Fleet rollouts are scheduled by city in batches so multiple vehicles complete per crew per week without rushing the install.

Multi-city in one week

Yes — that is most of fleet work. Graphics are pre-printed to one master spec from one print partner, kits ship to each install city, and certified wrap teams install to the same documented standard. End-of-week the brand has identical vehicles on the road in seven cities.

One spec, fabricated and installed in every U.S. market.
